Treasurer's Report	The balance in the bank at 31 May was, \$9,200. As at 30 June it was expected that about 120 members would have joined in advance of the new year, roughly in line with the previous year, but below the level of the previous record year.	

Vice President Governance	<p>Unfortunately, we still have no decision on the Stockland case in the Planning & Environment Court. It is now some months since the case was heard and concluded. Judge Rackemann appears to have a high workload of cases in the P&E Court as well as some cases in the Criminal Court. We have no indication about when a decision will be handed down but we will receive advance notice from his Associate of the timing of the announcement in the Court. We are continuing to monitor the court timetables on a daily basis. As previously advised, TWRA members will be advised by email as soon as the decision is handed down. Make sure you keep your 2013-14 membership current so that you are among the first to know!</p> <p>We are still encouraging members to respond to the State Government's initiative to develop a 30 Year Plan for Queensland. If you have not already done so, please go on-line and complete the survey seeking views from as many Queenslanders as possible. We will re-circulate our earlier email this week to refresh your memory and provide the link necessary to participate in the survey.</p>	
Vice President Infrastructure	The contractors Prime are doing a great job and Twin Waters is looking terrific.	
Vice President Social	Next social event is the Xmas in July to be held at Lily's at Novotel on 28 July. Malcolm Smith reported that to date there were 97 acceptances and that he would shortly commence requesting that those attending pay so there is no last minute scramble.	
Bus Shelters	Peter B. reported on the slowly moving bus shelters and indicated that he was meeting with a council officer to survey the pick up points to try to get a suitable location.	
Cr Jason O'Pray	<p>Jason O'P. reported on the proposed kayak launching ramps and expected that work would commence shortly. He commented on the erosion that had damaged the Coast's beaches and the necessity of Council to close a number of beach access points. De-amalgamation was making for robust debates within council but Noosa based councillors were cooperative. Cost for the new Noosa Council currently stood at about \$21M. The de-amalgamation will come at a cost to both councils. He commented that the maintenance of the TW area was the best on the Coast. A new method of community grants was being put in place and individual councillors would be able to able to authorise grants with one grant of up to \$10,000 and others of \$2,000. These would be for infrastructure and on a one for one basis with local organizations. He reported that Air New Zealand would shortly be commencing flights into the Sunshine Coast and that they would be for a longer period this year and were expected to generate \$20M in tourist spending.</p>	
Neighbourhood Watch	Con G reported break & enter in Barcoola Place; car stolen with keys located within the residence. Graffiti on Ocean Dr bridge (now removed), also on Energex Transformer in T/W Dr (reported to	

	Energex) and further on entry statement wall into Wattlebird Dr. Qld Gvt and Police advise that Qld NHW will move to a mainly online organisation with online members.
